What is the Leaving Certificate Applied?



- It is a distinct, self-contained two-year Leaving Certificate programme aimed at preparing students for adult and working life.
- It emphasises forms of achievement and excellence which the established Leaving Certificate has not recognised in the past




Rationale for Leaving Certificate Applied

- Prepares learners for the demanding transition to adult and working life.
- Recognises talents of all learners programme responsive to aptitudes, abilities, needs and interests.
- Provides opportunity to develop in terms of responsibility, selfesteem and self-knowledge.
- Develops communication and decision making skills.
- Helps learners achieve a more independent and enterprising approach to learning and to life.

- Visitors







Teachers Perspective

"It is a great programme for students who like hands on and they can see they are progressing and achieving as they complete tasks immediately, not after two years of work. Certain subjects have a mix of project, short questions and long questions assessment. This allows everyone to achieve and succeed. It allows students to gain marks before they go into the exam, taking the pressure off."

Fergal Quinn Award

Feargal Quinn Awards" is presented each year to those students who obtain the top credits in the Leaving Certificate Applied Examination of that year.

The top performing students are notified by the State Examinations Commission.

The student's final credit total is based on their performance in the Leaving Certificate Applied Examination over the two years.

Progression From LCA

Tertiary education programme:

The <u>tertiary education programme</u> is a new way to get a degree at third level.

How the programme works:

- You start your course in a further education college, usually an Education and Training Board (ETB). You will attend the ETB for 1 to 2 years depending on your course. There are no fees when you attend an ETB
- 2. You then progress to third level to complete your degree in a higher education college or university.
- 3. All courses lead to a degree at Level 7 or 8 on the <u>National Framework of Qualifications (NFQ)</u>.

Do I need Leaving Cert or CAO points?

No. You do not apply through the <u>CAO</u> and you do not need the same Leaving Certificate points.

However, there are entry requirements to get on a course with the <u>Tertiary education programme</u>.

How to apply for a tertiary course?

Applications for courses in 2025-2026 will open from 1 February 2025

What course can I do with the tertiary education programme?

Over 40 different courses starting in 2025.

- Music and Sound Production
- Software Development
