What is Transition Year?

TY acts as a bridge between Junior Cert and Leaving Cert.

It aims to promote maturity by making students more self-directed learners through the development of general, technical and academic skills.

Ty programmes challenge students intellectually, gives them an orientation to the world of work and cater for the development of their personal and social awareness.

Fab Lab



- Digital fabrication laboratories, set up to inspire students to turn their ideas into new products by giving them access to a range of advanced digital manufacturing technologies.
- Students learn how to invent and make new things using a combination of open source design software and computer controlled machines.
- Starting off with simple, personalised, small items, the group then progress to bigger, more dynamic, shared projects, culminating in a piece of art.
